## Revamped Midtown park to reopen

ANCHORAGE, Alaska -- After being closed for a year, a popular midtown park is welcoming visitors again.

The Cuddy Family Midtown Park officially reopens Saturday at 11 a.m.

Among the many events are performances by the Alaska Theatre of Youth, a roller derby exhibition, and a climbing wall.

Parks and Rec officials say the newly unveiled park should create a sense of community and belonging.

"Getting to meet other people, coming together, enjoying the outdoors being healthy and active," said Jeff Dillon, Parks and Rec director. "The connection to the library, the revitalization of Midtown -- I think there are a lot of things this park is going to be able to accomplish."

The park is located just south of the Loussac Library.
