

Volunteer project will upgrade Delaney Park Strip

Anchorage, Alaska - It will take four days, 5,000 volunteer hours and \$250,000. But once it's done, the upgrade to part of the Delaney Park Strip will be complete.

It's part of the United Way '50 Hours of Caring' project and will transform the city's first park. In addition to adding hundreds of flowers, volunteers will re-vamp the ball fields; build seating areas, picnic pockets and a 20-foot wide walkway.
